SP/18/008 Welcome and Apologies

Mary Ross-Gower had resigned from the group. Cllr Nicklin expressed his regret and asked that thanks and gratitude be conveyed to Mary for her work on the Neighbourhood Plan.

SP/18/009 Minutes

The minutes of the meeting held on 1st June 2018 were approved.

SP/18/010 Review of Terms of Reference

SP/18/010.1 CIL

A CIL Policy had been drawn up by the Finance and assets Committee and approved by Council. Projects that benefit the committee could be submitted – they must be planned, active and ready to go. The Council would create a priority list. The Finance and Assets Committee had asked the SPRWG to identify any projects from the Neighbourhood Plan. This was agreed. Members would offer contributions under the three themes from the Neighbourhood Plan – a place to live, a place to work and a place to enjoy.

SP/18/010.2 Revision of Neighbourhood Plan

Under the Terms of Reference the SPRWG will look at recommendations for revisions to the Neighbourhood Plan (NP). Since Wiltshire Council is working on local plans up to 2036 it was agreed to look at what revisions were

necessary for the NP and aim to have a revised version by November 2020 for approval by May 2021. All members would look at the current NP for any redundant issues as the first contribution.

SP/18/010.3 Membership

It was agreed to invite Nigel Linge and Harriet James to join the group.

SP/18/011 Progress of the Core Strategy Planning Applications

Archaeological excavations were taking place north of Victoria Road. Persimmon may start building on the south of Victoria Road this year.

SP/18/012 Settlement Boundary Definitions

Wiltshire Council had responded to comments on the boundary revisions. They were excluding areas that have not yet been built on despite having been given planning permission. They would redefine the boundary when the developments had taken place. The group was concerned that this made the boundary fairly worthless.

SP/18/013 Borehill Farm Public Meeting 19 Oct 5pm

The Environment Agency had responded to local concerns about the smell from the biodigester and had arranged a public meeting in the function room of the Bell and Crown at 5pm on 19^{th} October.

SP/18/014 Wiltshire Local Plan Review

The consultation workshop on the Local Plan Review for the Trowbridge HMA would be held at County Hall on 29th October. Cllrs Fraser and Nicklin would attend on behalf of the Town Council and Len Turner on behalf of the SPRWG (NP). Tom Dommett to arrange registration.

SP/18/014 Reformation of the Town Regeneration Working Group

The Town Regeneration Group was meeting again with the Area Board of Wiltshire Council. Cllrs Fraser and Nicklin were members. Discussions were ongoing regarding the Central Car Park area and how it might be redeveloped.

Longleat was hosting a Wiltshire and Swindon Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP) business growth conference on 4th October to update on the progress of the local business community. Local businesses were invited to register. Len Turner would be attending.

SP/18/015.02 Calendar of Meetings

It was agreed to hold regular meetings of the group to review the NP. Dates would be arranged to allow feedback to the Town Development Committee.

Concerned about speeding traffic in Warminster? We need your help.

Boreham Road, Copheap Lane and Deverill Road have been identified as the top priorities in Warminster

We're looking for volunteers to join in with our Community Speedwatch. Community Speedwatch is an initiative where members of the public join with the Police to monitor speeds of vehicles using speed detection devices.

Boreham Rd, Copheap Lane and Deverill Road have been identified as being suitable for the scheme following surveys that indicate high levels of vehicles travelling above the speed limit.

All volunteers are trained by the Police to monitor traffic speed and comply with a code of practice. Community Speed Watch only takes place where there is an identified speeding issue in a 20mph, 30mph or 40mph speed limit.

Vehicles exceeding the speed limit are referred to the Police with the aim of educating drivers to reduce their speeds. In cases where education is blatantly ignored and evidence of repeat or excessive offences is collated, then enforcement and prosecution follow.

Dear Ms Fox

I would be grateful if you would pass this letter on to the relevant councillor or department.

The house I live in is on the corner of West Parade and Pound Street. I have lived there since 1981 and there has always been a problem with lorries attempting to negotiate Pound Street. However, in recent years, the problem has become much worse with very large articulated lorries attempting to make a right turn from West Parade into Pound Street or even from Pound Street into West Parade. Inevitably, they have huge difficulty and can take a long time to successfully make the turn causing inconvenience to local residents and the local bus because the road is blocked and they have to detour.

It is very distressing for the lorry drivers who find themselves in this dilemma as they are merely following the directions of their sat-nav and are unaware of how unsuitable their route is until they arrive at this corner. I must confess, I am frequently frightened that a lorry will hit our house as they are forced to mount the pavement and pass so close. (A few years ago, a lorry did cause damage to a property in Pound Street and to our roof when the driver attempted to make a right turn from Pound Street into West Parade.)






Vew from West Burade 1/11/18
