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Update for Town Development Committee – 17th February 2020

1. Regeneration Working Group

The meeting was positive and the main outcome was the Director Economic Development and Planning (Wiltshire) would seek to facilitate a consultation/Planning for real workshop

2 . NPRWG and Neighbourhood Plan

A meeting was held on 24th January to assess Jeff Bishop, of Place Studios (PS) a Consultant. Place Studio is an independent award-winning urban design and place-shaping consultancy. They specialise in community engagement and collaborative approaches to design and planning.

Jeff has a wealth of experience and has provided a thorough outline for the way forward. His company is award-winning and has been involved in projects such as Widcombe in Bath, Ross and Wye and others which have delivered what the community wants. He has a good knowledge of Wiltshire and

Priorities for the review of the content of the Plan are:

Jeff Bishop that much of what the Town Council wished to achieve could be achieved if:

- There was more clear, robust, objective supporting evidence for policies.
- Policy phrasing was appropriate, specific and in 'planning speak' such that it could to be used to assess planning applications and, if necessary, to refuse them and not be subject to successful challenge.

Agreed priorities for the review of the plan are:

- Revisiting those policy areas deleted or weakened in the current plan.

It was suggested that improvements could be made regarding: Settlement Boundary, Green Infrastructure, Design, Community Facilities, Employment, Town Centre, Surrounding Environment, Local Green Spaces, Green Spaces, Pedestrian and Cycle Routes

NEW POLICY AREAS

There is no doubt that the key area to pick up on in any Neighbourhood Plan today is climate change, because of national, Wiltshire and Warminster Town Council commitments to tackling it. This would sit under the suggested main heading of 'A Place for the Future' and probably be subdivided into text and policies, supported where appropriate by evidence, on: sustainable design and construction, flooding, permeable surfaces, car charging points, tree

cover and renewable energy. Biodiversity would be included. There are three aspects of house building on which policies could be added: Custom and Self-build Housing, Community-led Housing and Homeworking. Other polices could be added on Telecommunications, Allotments, Pre-application Community Engagement.

Members are engaged in ongoing discussions with Place Studio to agree a proposed way forward.
