

I live at upper March Road, which is a property situated down a private road off the main road betwind the Church and we are one of properties on this private read. The reason I am writing is because I am very concerned that there is going to be an accident at the entrance to our read one day, because invariably there are vehicles pasked most of the time, on our left hard side, and if they are partied right up to the entrance to our road, unless one is in a high vehicle that allows one to see cars coming into Upper Marsh Road from the left then we have to take a rick and pull out band, as most of us living here all have small cars All I am asking for to hop keep is safe is a short yellow line on the light next to our interner probably, the length of I cars I do hope you can consider this request before someone gets badly injured of worse killed

Section 2 Our private lane, which is included in the Upper Marsh Road BAIZ9PJ address, is between the Churchyard of Christ Church and the bungalow 'church View' 12 Upper Marsh Road and runs behind Christ Church. At the junction of the lane and the main Upper Marsh Road, either side of the private lane is very often busy with parked rehicles. Along with the 'normal' residential parked vehicles, the road is also affected by: a) church services and organised community groups there, which can be at any time of the day or evening. b) As the town park has become more popular, it is even busier than before with people parking each side of Weymouth Street, continuing right around the corner into Upper Marsh Road. We are gettino visitors to the park from outside of

Section 3 i) It is very difficult to see if it is sape to pull out of the lane due to vehicles parking so close to the junction of the There was an accident on 31/08/22 Where the police were involved. Please see Photo 4. The photo was taken from Glebe Field, looking towards Upper Marsh Koad. Our lane is between the police car and the fire engine in the photo. Due to the fact that vehicles were parked along the entire one side of upper Marsh Ro there is only a single vehicle width for vehicles to drive with no passing spaces for oncoming vehicles. A vehicle came from each direction-we believe the vehicle on its side dipped the kerb to avoid the oncoming our and the other can damaged several other parked cours

in the accident.

If there were double yellow lines extending either side of our lane, there could be a useful space for cars to pull in,

making it saper for other drivers too.

ii)Visibility of the highway is a huge
concorn, as when rehicles are parked
along Upper Marsh Rd, they certainly do
obscure sight lines at the junction,
making it very risky to pull out of the
lane. Many of the vehicles that park
either side of the private lane park
beyond the dropped kerb, so visibility
is even more obscured, and pulling
out at the junction is precarious.

#### Section 2 - The Issue

On a regular basis...every week at least...waste and large HGVs and also coaches going to the Minster School have difficulty in going up Emwell Street or are unable to proceed and have to reverse out of the street. The main blockage place is outside my house, Emwell House, 7 Emwell Street, BA12 8JA. As a result of this, some years ago the council painted a single white line across the entrance to my gates. However people, including residents of Emwell Street ignore this and park over it. The solution would be simple: to extend the existing double yellow line on the south side of the road by 6 metres.

#### Section 3 - Safety Concerns

Does the issue raised have any particular impact on road safety? For example do you know of any accidents that have occurred due to the problem and were the police/emergency services involved, do you have any dates that accidents occurred? Are there concerns with visibility of the highway, for example parked vehicles obscuring sight lines at junctions

There have been occasions when parked cars have had their wing mirrors damaged and bodywork scratched. In these circumstances it would have been impossible for a fire engine to get through the street. This is particularly important as The Minster Primary School is at the end of the street.

Have there been any issues with access for Emergency Services, Public Transport or have there been occasions when your bins weren't emptied due to access issues. If so was this reported to the relevant authority, to whom and when?

Over the years, on a regular basis, the bin Lorries have been unable to reach my bins (and others) and have had to reverse out of Emwell Street. In the past 4 weeks this has been the case and twice the Green Bin waste lorry was unable to go up the street so the bins remained un-emptied. Whenever this happens I phone and report this to the council waste authorities.




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
