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1 Actions to be taken before a flood

A General

Warminster Town Council admin to sign up with Environment Agency and Met Office for weather alerts.

Town Council Website to have a flood section – giving advice and sources of information and advice, including: sandbag policy, Environment Agency Website, Wiltshire Council Website, English Heritage Website (Flooding Section) propertycare.org.

When there are flood warnings the Town Council Website and Facebook to highlight/direct people to this section

Town Council to maintain a list of Gullies that if blocked can cause internal flooding to residential homes and/or businesses. Wiltshire Council have a list to cross reference with.

Businesses at risk of flooding to be identified and suggested steps

Annual safety training to be given to Flood Wardens, organised by Warminster Town Council.

Updating of flood plan when new mapping of water courses become available

Annual audit of flood warning signs – number, location and additional needs

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



E Emergency evacuation

- Following the Flood Alert and at the onset of the Flood Warning, the emergency co-ordinating team will be in contact with Wiltshire Council to co-ordinate emergency procedures. The team will comprise the Town Clerk and other staff member, three Flood Wardens and one or two Councillors. The team will be based at the Town Council offices.
- Any necessary emergency evacuation will be handled by the emergency services, which have procedures in place. The Flood Wardens are aware of vulnerable people who need extra help and will work with the emergency services and the emergency co-ordinating team.
