

Warminster Splash Pad is Launched



Warminster Town Council launched its new space themed splash pad on Monday 30th May at 10am.

The splash pad was opened by Mayor of Warminster, Councillor Chris Robbins. Speaking before he cut the ribbon, Councillor Robbin said:

"Members, Distinguished Guests, WTC Staff and Members of the Public, We are gathered here today to officially open our Space themed Splash Pad.

This new facility replaces the paddling pool which was over 70 years old and could no longer be repaired. The Space themed design includes the Sun, Earth, Planets, Stars and Space Craft. There are a number of water features including a blaster, tipping buckets, water jets and a paddling area.

The Splash Pad has been eagerly awaited by both parents and children and I'm sure will bring much enjoyment to hundreds if not thousands of our community over the next 20 years. It's a fantastic addition to the Lake Pleasure Grounds and makes a great park even

better.

My Children used the Paddling pool, now my Grandchildren can use the Splash Pad. This facility is another major investment in the Lake Pleasure Grounds by the WTC, and if as popular as the Skate Park will be a wonderful addition.

There were many hurdles to overcome, we had to bring in more power to work the pump, a new water connection and build a water storage tank. We have invested in a water recycling system which goes along with our pledge to become a more responsible Council, delivering a brighter greener future for all. We calculated that in 10 years' time hopefully the savings on water will pay the bill.

This project has been a major investment by the Town Council. A large part of the bill has been financed by the Dewey Trust, and the Community Infrastructure Levy structure payable by developers. (We thank the Trustees of the Dewey Trust for their support)

Finally I wish to praise and thank my fellow Councillors for their considerable efforts, the Staff at WTC for their continued hard work, and our employees who will no doubt keep this facility flowing.

Completion of this project was of course planned just before the celebration of HM Queen's Platinum weekend of festivities whose reign has outlasted our retired Paddling Pool.

I now declare this Splash Pad Officially open"

Users of the splash pad are reminded children must wear swim nappies. Ordinary nappies must not be worn as these can block filters and require the closure of the splash pad. Swim nappies are available from the Pavilion Café in the Lake Pleasure Grounds. Food and drink must not be consumed on the splash pad. Pets, scooters, bicycles and anything that might damage the safety surface are not allowed.

Imagination, laughter, smiling and being splashed are allowed.

Local interest in the splash pad has been huge with people from nearby towns and villages planning trips to Warminster to have a go. Over 43,000 people have been reached on Facebook in just 4 days!



COUNCIL ELECTS NEW MAYOR AND DEPUTY MAYOR

At Warminster Town Council's annual meeting on 16th May, Councillor Chris Robbins was unanimously appointed Mayor for the ensuing municipal year. Councillor Phil Keeble was unanimously voted in as Deputy Mayor.

Chris lives in Warminster, is married to Debra and has four children and five grandchildren. Chris Robbins is a former employee of Lloyd's Bank and the long-standing proprietor of C J Robbins Butchers in the town center.

Councillor Robbins previously served as Mayor of Warminster in 2020. Speaking after his appointment, Councillor Robbins said:

'I thank my fellow councillors for electing me Mayor and it is an honour to be representing the town again in the coming year. My first period of office was rather limited due to the pandemic. I will do my upmost to attend and cover as many of the duties attached to the role, and with the support of the Deputy Mayor, I am hopeful we can achieve that goal.'

'We now have a new team working at Warminster Town Council and I am sure they will continue to work hard, achieve great things and provide quality services.'

'There is lots going on, we are in the process of renewing the Neighbourhood Plan, an important document that will shape the future of Warminster. In the Town Park, we are days away from completing another major project, a brand new Splash Pad and, like the Skate Park, will be well used by the younger community. We acknowledge Warminster needs investment and will over the coming months prompt and encourage all to improve our town. I am particularly interested in developing and improving our cycle / walking routes and would encourage all to ride or walk to school and work if they

Warminster Civic Centre Celebrates in Commemoration of Her Royal Highness' Platinum Jubilee

On Saturday 4th Warminster Town Council held a commemorative fair in celebration of Her majesty the Queen's 70 year reign, marking her service to the people of the United Kingdom, the Realms and the Commonwealth.

The fair was reminiscent of traditional family fun activities such as hook a duck, pin the diamond on the crown, name the corgi, guess how many sweets in the Jar to name but a few. Throughout the Civic Centre, there was a resounding sound of laughter and good cheer as children won prizes.

The Mayor of Warminster, Councillor Chris Robbins, opened the Fair having judged cakes that were submitted for the Civic Centre 'Bake Off', along with Councillors Phil Keeble and Sue Fraser. The entries varied from three tier show stoppers to a 3d stamp with the Queen's profile and a corgi wearing a bejewelled crown. The winner of the Junior Bake off, Anna, created a three tier Fondant iced sponge cake adorned with chocolate crowns, jelly baby Royal Guards and a union flag flying high on top of the cake. Charlie, the winner of the adult category created an incredible 3d profile of the Queen's head adorned with multiple sugar craft flowers using marzipan fondant icing.

Both winners were awarded a 'Bake off Winner' certificate Star Baker trophy and wooden Spoon. With the runners up receiving a star baker certificate and wooden spoon.

Children were also encouraged to arrive in fancy dress of a royal theme. King Alfred arrived sword in hand along with a couple of princesses and corgis. Winner, Princess Jasmine and Runner up King Arthur were presented with vouchers and certificates. There was also a Royal tombola where revellers would pick out a king or queen that denoted what prize they would win. One special prize, a commemorative £5 coin was won by Imogen who had also won runner up star baker in the junior category.
