AGM and Mayoral election

We are delighted to welcome Councillor Phil Keeble as the new Mayor of Warminster and Councillor Stacie Allensby as the new Deputy Mayor. We would also like to extend a huge thank you to Councillor Chris Robbins for his term in office and service to the people and town of Warminster.

Councillor Phil Keeble has said:

'I thank my fellow Councillors for their support and trust in electing me as Mayor and leader of The Council. It is an honour, and a duty I take seriously and undertake to serve this Council and people of Warminster to the best of my ability.

I wish to thank the former Mayor, Councillor Chris Robbins for his work as Mayor and representing this town so well. I thank him for his leadership, friendship and advice throughout the last 12 months - it has been a privilege to be your apprentice.



For this coming year I look forward to the completion of the review of our neighborhood plan. This is an incredibly important document that reflects the public's wishes for the shape and future of Warminster and has already taken a considerable amount of hard work to this point.

'A common theme on engaging with the public on this review is the number of empty shops in the town and the need for local jobs for local people. I therefore wish to focus on the regeneration of the economy of Warminster. As a Council I believe we

should all do what we can to support existing and encouraging new local businesses, promoting the shop local ethos and partnering with the newly former Warminster Business Network. We should all be setting an example by buying goods and services locally as much as possible.

'I also want to see renewed effort to develop and finalise our Climate Change Action Plan and drive through the changes required to achieve the Council's carbon net zero target by 2030. I am encourage that we are currently tendering for solar panels but there is still much work to be done.

'We are now also days away from the completion and opening of two major projects, namely the tennis courts MUGA refurbishment and CCTV upgrade. I would like to thank the Councillors and Officers of the Council in making these projects happen. Again, I thank you and look forward to the coming year.'

The new Deputy Mayor, Councillor Stacie Allensby has been a Councillor since 2021. She said: 'I was surprised and honoured to be nominated for the position as deputy Mayor. I have learnt a lot from my fellow councillors and still have much to learn but hope that I can carry on doing my best for the people of Warminster.'

Tennis Court

We are delighted to announce that the muchanticipated tennis courts and multi-use game area (MUGA) will be reopening on the 30th of May.

The online booking will be found via the LTA website: 'www.lta.org.uk/play' and via Warminster Town Council dedicated booking platform or on an app. This will make it far easier to find and book a court at the Lake Pleasure Grounds. For a year's membership, it will cost £40 and allow for up to 4 hours per week playtime. However, anyone wishing to use it without a membership can pay £6 for a single court for an hour. The MUGA will be free for all to use.



This has been a project long in the waiting and we hope you can enjoy and appreciate this exceptional community asset. Keep your eyes out for further updates regarding specific dates and booking details.

It has been over 8 years in the making, with the LTA and Warminster Town Council investing £241,000 as part of a national effort to promote tennis in local communities.

Coronation Success

Festivities included the Coronation Window Display competition, won by Wessex MS Trust Charity shop and a screening of the Coronation in the Civic Centre. The local community really banded together to make this a memorable and meaningful celebration. CCTV

Warminster and Westbury Councils are delighted to announce their partnership over their new CCTV system. The new network is a collaborative initiative to assist Wiltshire Police forces in their efforts. There are a total of 44 cameras spread over Warminster, Westbury and West Wiltshire Trading Estate.

CCTV is about prevention, deterrence and detection of crime, helping to provide a safer environment for the general public and reducing the fear of criminal behaviour. CCTV operators watch out for issues such as anti-social behaviour, shoplifting, assaults, public order offences, domestic violence, missing persons, drink driving or drug dealing. Even in its testing and early phases of activation, the network has provided some promising results in identifying vandals and anti-social activity.

The CCTV team is made up of both paid staff and volunteers. They are always looking for additional volunteers. Neighbourhood Plan Update

Over the last year, local volunteers have been working on collecting information and evidence to update the current Warminster Neighbourhood Plan. This will help shape the future vision and development of Warminster.

During March and April, the local community were invited to contribute to the plan by providing their thoughts and feedback on the draft plan and data collected. Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the online surveys. In addition to an overview survey there were also a range of topic specific surveys including community facilities, local green spaces and the town centre. Over 1,300 surveys were completed. The data collected from this consultation will now be taken into consideration when updating the draft plan.

The first draft of the full plan will be shared with the public later in the year, at which point, there will be an additional opportunity for the community to comment on the content.


