Do you know your flood risk in Warminster?

Flooding is dangerous and can happen quickly. The effects can be devastating.

If it happens you can be prepared. Look inside to find out how.

What can you do now?

Check if you are at risk of flooding from main rivers, groundwater and surface water.

You can sign up to receive free flood warnings for the River Wylde and groundwater in Warminster.

Sign up to the MetOffice National Severe Weather Warning Service via web or app

Make a personal flood plan and a checklist of things you need should you need to leave your home.

What you can do to help slow, or stop flooding in your home - Property Flood Resilience (PFR)

If you own part of the riverbank, you should keep the banks and bed of the river clear of debris. For information and guidance visit www.gov.uk/guidance/owning-a-watercourse

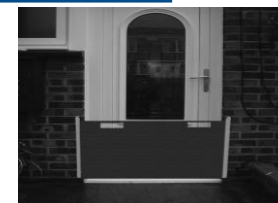
You or your landlord could buy flood boards to help stop water coming through the door or airbrick covers from surface water flooding or flooding from the river.

Assess installing a sump and pump, especially for groundwater flooding. Make sure any PFR is accessible, serviced and working, e.g. pumps and seals.

When groundwater rises it may become difficult to flush the toilet. Check that your toilet can still flush. If not, you may need to order a Portaloos.

What can you do if you get a flood warning?

Flood warning is time to take action – flooding is expected in the following hours.

Check that your family, neighbours and pets are okay.



Move important things upstairs or to higher shelves, so they don't get covered in dirty flood water.



Install or activate any property flood resilience measures for your home. Could someone do this for you if you are away?
