# Remembering Councillor Rob Fryer

Rob, born 13/3/1939, was first elected to the Council in 2007 and was twice elected Mayor of the town during 2012-2013 and again between 2017-2018. A keen river swimmer and writer, Rob, of Portway, Warminster, learned to swim in the River Cherwell while at school in Oxford. He moved to Warminster, in 1965, and soon started swimming at the Farleigh & District Swimming Club in the River Frome near Trowbridge.

The current Mayor of Warminster, Cllr Philip Keeble said: "Rob will be deeply missed. He had such enthusiasm and passion for Warminster and for getting things done. He was instrumental in securing the return of boat hire on the Lake.

"He was Mayor at the time of the first Spring in the Park and would make a special effort to attend any event in the Park. He loved the return of Bands to the Bandstand and innovations like the splashpad. Rob had a mischievous sense of humour and would sometimes lob a comment in at meetings just to stir things up. Although a Conservative, he always viewed himself as a bit of a rebel. RIP Rob Fryer."

# <u>Warminster Remembrance Service and Parade - Sunday 12th November</u>

# Warminster Neighbourhood Plan

Progress continues to be made with the review of the Warminster Neighbourhood Plan.

Feedback has been gathered from the initial public consultation. This has enabled the Warminster Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group to shape the draft Warminster Neighbourhood Plan in preparation for the next stage of public consultation, known as Regulation 14.

The current Warminster Neighbourhood Plan is being updated to take advantage of changes to local and national planning policies. The Plan aims to improve environmental and design standards of new buildings. It strives to protect valued local green space & heritage assets and assist in renewing the town centre.

The updating of the Plan provides an exciting opportunity to shape our town and our future. The next stage in the review process will be for the draft policies to be screened for environmental impacts. This procedure will need to be undertaken before public consultation can commence. Early indications would now suggest that public consultation will start early in the new year.

After the consultation, the draft Plan may be amended before going to a Planning Inspector for consideration and then the final proposals will have to be ratified by a referendum of Warminster residents.

The four awards now open for nomination are as follows:

- The Civic Award (over 18 years of age) made to an individual who has made a significant difference for the community of Warminster
- The Junior Civic Award (under the age of 18) given to an individual for achievement within the community
- The Green Civic Award for environmental issues for setting an example or changing behaviour of others which can be awarded to an individual, or group
- The Environmental Award for businesses to recognise their contribution towards tackling climate change and working towards net zero

The four Civic Awards are held in equal standing and judging of nominees will be based on:

- · Highlighting the example of community spirit
- · Focussing on those who have 'gone the extra mile'
- Motivating others to act positively, which will be considered as important as individual efforts

#### Flood advice

With the winter months ahead and weather potentially getting worse, below is key information to protect against the risk of flooding.

- Blocked drains are to be reported via MyWilts
- Residents and businesses at risk of flooding should sign up to the <u>flood</u> <u>warning service</u>
- If residents/businesses experience internal flooding a detailed account including photographs is to be sent to WTC <a href="mailto:admin@warminster-tc.gov.uk">admin@warminster-tc.gov.uk</a>
- Properties at risk of flooding should consider investing in defence measures and prepare a personal flood plan

Warminster Town Council is looking for additional flood wardens. Flood wardens can help by:

- Reporting blocked drains, ditches and streams
- Making notes when heavy rain occurs so better preventative measures can be put in place
- Supporting residents by directing them to where they can get advice

Full training is provided along with protective clothing, equipment and support. Please contact Warminster Town Council if you are interested in more information.



# **Anyone for tennis?**

The Warminster Lake Pleasure Grounds tennis courts looking ace from above.

In total there are five tennis courts and a Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA) for public play. The MUGA is free to use all the time, and the tennis courts are £6 per one hour session or £40 for a year's membership, which allows up to 4 hours a week playtime.
