Longleat letter trail for chance to win VIP prize

Warminster Town Council has teamed up with world famous Longleat Safari Park to put on a summer holiday letter trail in Warminster. The stars of the park have appeared in 14 posters in businesses across the town centre.

To take part in the challenge, simply download the 'Explore Wiltshire' App, available to download for free from the Apple App Store: Apple App Store: Explore Wiltshire and Google Play: Google Play: Explore Wiltshire (download the Warminster content and select hunts) find 'Longleat Safari letter trail', which will guide users around the town and to the location of each animal poster.

Each poster gives a letter; once you have collected all the letters, unscramble them to work out the Longleat phrase – visit the Civic Centre (Sambourne Road, Warminster BA12 8LB) and tell us the answer, as well as showing confirmation on your phone of completing the trail. The tennis courts at Warminster Lake Pleasure Grounds remain <u>ready to serve the community.</u>

In total there are five tennis courts for public play costing £6 per one hour session or £40 for a year's membership, which allows up to 4 hours a week playtime. The tennis courts in Warminster Lake Pleasure Grounds can be used all year round and continue to prove popular since receiving significant investment in 2023. Autumn Market to serve up more success

The Warminster Business Network in conjunction with Warminster Town Council is preparing to host another popular independent market on Sunday 1st September. The Warminster Independent Autumn Market will have a focus on food and drink. There will be 100 plus stalls, street entertainment and live music with activities for all the family with the High Street and Market Place closed.

There will also be an interesting mix of stalls and food inside the Civic Centre in Sambourne Road with the joined-up event running from 10am to 4.30pm. The market aims to promote local businesses and encourage visitors to all areas of the town. St Lawrence Chapel will once again be hosting Chapel tours, with many independent shops and cafes also open for business.

A Warminster Business Network spokesperson said: "The third market of the year looks to offer something a little different while maintaining the heart of the success so far. The town comes alive during the events, and we cannot wait for this one."

As the event is on a Sunday, parking will be available at Wiltshire Council car parks around Warminster for just 70p for the whole day. New stalls are constantly being added to the exciting event. Warminster Town Council awards £17,000 grants to local groups

Warminster Town Council has awarded almost £17.000 to local groups in Warminster following discussion at the council's Finance and Audit Committee.

Councillors gave full consideration to all aspects of the grant applications received during the meeting and agreed the grants to be given to 11 different organisations. This year all the grants awarded came from the council's own budget, with grants ranging from £200 to £2,500.

All grant recipients are required to attend the Annual Town Meeting in April 2025 to explain how the grant has been used.

CCTV success

Warminster Police received a report from Warminster CCTV of shoplifting in progress in July. This call had come into them via the Shop Watch radio scheme which is managed by the CCTV team. Quick reporting enabled the CCTV team to track the suspect and provide police with up to date information. The male was swiftly arrested and transported to Melksham Custody.

Warminster and Westbury CCTV partnership is overseen by a working group of representatives from Warminster Town Council, Westbury Town Council, Wiltshire Council, the Army, Wiltshire Police, West Wilts Trading Estate and local businesses. Its success is built on special relationships between these partners to deliver a service to the community.
